IRC 2016 - 3rd Announcement - October 2015

The **hotels** are booked, pre and mid congress **tours** are arranged, the main invited **speakers** are confirmed and we are now **ready for you to register** for the congress and **submit a paper** - for oral or poster presentation - featuring your research, or management ideas on range/grassland/wild lands related to one of the many topic categories on the program.

We have put together an **ambitious program** to meet the aim of the IRC to promote the interchange of scientific and technical information on all aspects of rangelands and grass farming and management of wildlands including: research, planning, development, reclamation, management, extension, education and training.

If you are a rancher, grass farmer, extension agrologist, range manager, land reclamation specialist, parks or wild lands supervisor, researcher, modeler, remote sensing specialist or a person interested in the management of the world's grazing and wild lands you are invited to make an oral or poster presentation involving your work or operation. **Full Paper Submission Guidelines** are included in the enclosed materials. The **deadline** for receiving paper submissions has been **extended until February 29, 2016**.

Rangelands are important in Canada, and in particular to the agricultural economy of Saskatchewan, which has almost 5 million ha of native grass rangelands, about 2 million ha of introduced hay, and 1.6 million ha of perennial pasture crops out of a total of nearly 26 million ha of agricultural land. The livestock industries, which include beef, dairy, sheep, buffalo, and exotic or game livestock, depend on rangelands and perennial grasslands for the base of their feed resources.

Exciting, informative **pre-congress** and **mid-congress tours** will showcase western Canadian rangelands, livestock operations, cultural and heritage sites, and the spirit of the people. Our tour committee has developed a **seven day pre-congress tour** visiting the grazing and wild lands of southern and central Saskatchewan and Alberta including a special day spent in Banff in Canada's majestic Rocky Mountains. There are two other pre congress tours of **three** and **four** days which will concentrate on the southern mixed prairie of Saskatchewan and the parkland are in central Saskatchewan and Alberta. In addition, there are nine one day **mid congress tours** which will be included in your registration fee.

You are also invited to take part in one of the complimentary workshops to be held on Saturday and Sunday prior to the start of the congress.

The Congress will take place in **Saskatoon**, which is centrally located in the Canadian portion of the Northern Great Plains grasslands of North America. Saskatoon's **airport** (**yxe.ca**) has daily

connections to Canadian airline hubs in Toronto, Calgary and Vancouver, and to Minneapolis, in the USA.

Saskatchewan, in the heart of the Canadian prairies is a great place for an international congress as well as an extended holiday with your family. You could stay on a holiday ranch, go fishing in northern Saskatchewan, watch prairie sunsets or spend time in Canada's Rocky mountains only a 7-hour drive from Saskatoon before or after the congress. The University of Saskatchewan (**Kids Camps**) and the Recreation Department of the City of Saskatoon (**Play Programs**) offer various summer activities for children during the time of the congress.

The Congress headquarters will be in the **Teacher's Credit Union Place** (TCUP), located in downtown Saskatoon within walking distance to congress designated hotels. The South Saskatchewan River flows through Saskatoon and provides a beautiful park with the **Meewasin Trails** and **River Landing** for recreation just a few blocks from downtown.

Getting to IRC 2016

John G. Diefenbaker Airport - YXE

Delegates arriving by air will fly into John G. Diefenbaker International Airport (http://yxe.ca/). The airport is serviced by Air Canada, WestJet and Delta airlines. TCU Place and the Congress hotels are about a 10 min (5.5 km) drive from the airport. The airport information desk is located in the center of the main terminal and a security agent is there to assist with airport related questions. There is also a tourist information booth located in the middle of the arrivals area with information on Saskatoon.

Do you require a Visa or eTA?

Most travellers need a valid entry document such as an **Electronic Travel Authorization** (eTA) or a **visa** to visit Canada. This will depend on your citizenship or your situation.

Canada has introduced a new entry requirement, known as an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA), for visa-exempt foreign nationals travelling to Canada by air. **Exceptions include U.S. citizens and travellers with a valid visa.** On March 15, 2016, this new requirement will become mandatory and travellers will need an eTA before they can board their flight to Canada.
